AWARD

The informal tourney *Sinfonie Scacchistiche* attracted 56 studies by 22 composers from 13 countries. Peter Krug from Austria was very prolific with no less than 18 originals, while the "new" Italian composer P. Luciano Placanico submitted a fair 12 originals.

I dislike the way the studies are sometimes presented in *Sinfonie Scacchistiche*: it seems like all analytical lines the composer supplied are simply reproduced – boring!

Marco Campioli was helpful in providing comments on the studies in issues 116, 117, 118, and 119, although I am unhappy when he comments "not anticipated". That should be left to the judge. Campioli cooked the studies 430, 552, 554, 607, 608, 671, 808, 811, 813, and 815. The studies 430, 552, 608, 671, and 815 were corrected, but 608 and 671 were again cooked by Campioli.


I checked all studies, the cooks and corrections myself. The correction of **552** has an illegal initial position. I also have found more cooks: **428**: 1.Sc5! As a result, 41 sound studies remained. Among those studies, there are several very simple ones (e.g. 476, 551, 610, 670, 724). There is nothing wrong with such studies for an informal tourney, they just do not make it into the award. I do have a problem with study no. 798, which seems to be a correction of an unsound 1986 study by one of the composers (HHdbV#27197). But I cannot understand why the composers try to "hide" this by vertically mirroring the position. Just state it is a correction, give full details, and there would be no problem at all!

Another remarkable fact is that there are numerous logical studies in this tourney (e.g. 427, 474, 672, 673, 726, 727, 802) where the point of the difference between main line and solution is not shown because the lines divert. I suspect (but haven't checked this in detail: I cannot exclude that this is due to a poor presentation of the solution) that the reason is that the thematic try is flawed: there are duals in Black's refutation. This downgrades the thematic try to a simple interesting try, and thereby also downgrades the study.




"This is awarded first prize on the condition (...) that 1...g3 is not considered a second main line. White wants to play 3.Qc3, but this fails to 3...Qxe6! 4.dxe6 Ra1+ 5.Qxa1 stalemate. It is unclear to me why this line was not given! After a nice systematic manoeuvre with the wQ moving up and down the staircase, 10.Qc3 works, since now the bR is at c8 instead of a8. This would be interesting enough, but Black still tries uses the Q-sac on e6 to try escape by stalemate. It is highly appropriate that the wQ has to walk to staircase again for a win. An excellent stairway to heaven! (Gorgiev 1937 (HHdbV#66541) anticipates the final staircase, no problem)".
